

Most students live on campus in dormitories. Some centers also serve nonresidential students who live close to the center. While enrolled in the program, you'll receive housing, meals, basic medical care, and a living allowance. The most successful students stay in the program between 1 and 2 years.

Career Technical Training

Job Corps offers hands-on training in more than 100 career technical training areas, including Welding, Automobile Technician, Carpentry, Office Administration, Clinical Medical Assistant, Culinary Arts, Computer Technician, and many more. Employment and Training for Mature Workers : Persons aged 55+ on the Senior Community Service and Employment Program (SCSEP) are placed in part-time positions in public and non-profit agencies for training to enable them to enter the workforce. Funded by the National Council on Aging, assistance is provided to residents of 120 Georgia counties.

- 2. Is homeless and is scheduled to become a resident of permanent housing within 90 days.
- 3. Has exited permanent housing within the previous 90 days to seek alternative low-income housing.
